As you all know, the mission of AAUW is to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy. At the state level, the Legislature began its 2025 long session on January 21, and there are, of course, enormous problems and issues for the Oregon legislators to confront. Our January meeting guest speaker, **Claire Berger**, the AAUW of Oregon Public Policy Chair, leads the AAUW charge on the state level to support bills that relate to our mission of equity for women.

Claire enthusiastically told us that there is a new process that will be used this year which includes more inclusion of members statewide – essentially member-chosen campaigns where our membership can have more of a direct influence on the process on bills that impact them and their communities.

Claire encouraged all of us to get ready to advance legislation that makes a difference. This spring the **AAUW of Oregon 2025 Lobby Days** event will be held over the **week of March 17-21** with either in-person or virtual legislative appointments over Zoom, whichever the particular branch prefers.

As your Branch President, I hope that all branch members will support me and our Branch Public Policy Director, **Sharron Noone**, and volunteer to participate in our Branch's Lobby Day Event and take the oppor-

tunity to advocate for those bills essential to achieving our legislative priorities!

Sharron and I will be signing up the Branch to participate in 2025 Lobby Days with Claire and the AAUW of Oregon Public Policy Committee. Please let Sharron know if you are interested in participating. Do not worry if you have never done any type of advocacy before; training will be available, and there are experienced individuals participating as well.

Our next **Branch Meeting** will be held on **Monday, February 24, 2025,** at Elmer's Parkrose Restaurant at 11:30 am. Our Membership Vice President, **Arlene Lemieux**, has put together an excellent program for us. Report from AAUW National Office

DUES INCREASE Proposed annual dues increase: AAUW did not increase dues in FY 2025 and the board is now considering a 5-year plan to increase individual member dues at \$5 each year from 2025 to 2029. More than 6,000 of AAUW's 41,000 members are either Paid Life or Honorary Life Members and do not pay any national dues. Dues cover about 15% of AAUW's budget and do not cover the cost of member support. Consistently raising dues will cover more costs of member support and help offset increases in costs due to inflation. In keeping with AAUW's commitment to financial sustainability and the financial health of the national office, regular dues increases are necessary. I hope you took the opportunity to comment about the dues increase on the website.

DONATION CHECKS There have been complaints about donation checks taking as much as 60 days to be processed. AAUW National asks to remind members that donation checks DO NOT go directly to the AAUW office and staff: they go to a vendor at a separate address. The current vendor has once again experienced year-end delays, which disproportionately impacts donor's contributions. The Finance and Advancement Team put together a task force to prepare for a request for proposal for a new vendor/contractor.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE FOR COLLEGE WOMEN STUDENT LEADERS As you know, AAUW has given over this program to another organization. It is anticipated that the national website (www.aauw.org) will have information about this "revised" conference in the coming weeks.
