President's Message

The Gresham Area Branch of AAUW, Inc. had an exceptionally busy year as it celebrated its 54th birthday. Starting at our Board Planning Retreat, it was enthusiastically agreed that the Branch would participate in the AAUW Five-Star National Recognition Program for the very first time. We made real progress in achieving our goals. Our November Fundraiser, "Calling All Angels," raised more money than ever before for our Mt. Hood Community College (MHCC) scholarship endowment, funding to send two students to the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL), and donations for AAUW Funds and Branch Operations. We exceeded our endowment goal of \$140,000 for our MHCC Scholarship which permits a second year STEM student to receive a \$3,500 scholarship annually. Our Director of Public Policy led our Branch's legislative outreach as part of the AAUW of Oregon 2025 Lobby Days. Finally, the Branch submitted a nomination for the AAUW of Oregon Breaking Barriers Achievement Award for Founder Deborah Arthur and Director Nahlee Suvanveij of Portland State University's Higher Education in Prison Program and won.

Update for Website on Public Policy



There is a lot of suspense surrounding one of our Oregon Legislature Bills supported by State AAUW's Public Policy Committee. After scheduling a 3rd reading of SB1098, the ban-on-book-bans bill, three times it is now scheduled for June 9; if it passes, it goes to the governor. The four "money" bills that State AAUW Public Policy supported have no activity showing on the website. We are all waiting to see what happens with the Transportation funding. Thanks for your time and interest.

Although, the four "money" bills that State AAUW supported have no activity showing on the website, Ann Bard reports that HB3212, the bill that aimed to reduce pharmacy prices, has been scuttled by pharmaceutical lobbyists.

Legislative Leaders are aiming to wrap up by mid-June. Let me know if you have questions or want to join the Public Policy Committee. Thanks for your time and interest.


